



Compulsory Cat and Dog Microchipping



Drivers for reform

Post implementation review

...identified issues with the current operation of the database system, including:

- challenges of accessing records
- out of date records
- inconsistent standards and processes adopted by database companies

Pet Theft Taskforce


We recommend introducing:

- new requirements to register more details on dog microchip databases,
- taking forward other improvements to how the databases work, including exploring a single point of access
- enabling changes of keeper to be tracked more closely.






Standardise database operator processes

groups"







Single Point of Search



Updating records

- Annual reminder to check record is up to date
- Make it easier to update
- Ensure fees are proportionate and transparent



Duplicate records



- Creates complexity
- Harder to determine where pet resides
- Creates opportunity to register stolen pets
- Will require database operators not to create duplicate registrations

Transfer of keepership

- Strengthening process key recommendation of Pet Theft Taskforce
- Requirement to seek approval from the current keeper
- Allow current keeper 28 days to object
- Apply unless sufficient supporting evidence is available





Recording Missing Pets

 Mandatory requirement to record pet as missing



Improving Breeder Traceability

- Dog's breeder information to be permanent part of the record
- Details of the puppy's dam to become mandatory and permanent part of the record



Regulating database operators



- Work with database operators to ensure there is clear guidance
- Explore how database operators can demonstrate compliance

Implanting



- Review of the existing process for approving these courses
- Develop an approach for regular review of the training

Compulsory Cat Microchipping



 From 10 June 2024, all owned cats over the age of 20 weeks must be microchipped and registered with a compliant database

Next Steps

- Further discussions with database operators to refine recommendations
- End 2024 Amendments planned to the Microchipping of Cats and Dogs (England) Regulations 2023
- 2025 Planned introduction of the Single Point of Search
